1. Rejections of Pre-lodged Import Declaration (IMD) for Tariff validations

Under the UCC an Import declaration can be submitted up to 30 days before the presentation/arrival of the goods, as an IMD type declaration.

In order to facilitate the inclusion of Quota order numbers on a pre-lodged Import there is now a two-step Tariff validation process on IMD declarations.

Tariff validation is completed upon Registration of an IMD declaration, against the Taric data in force at that time, and again upon Acceptance of the declaration against the Taric data in force on the date of acceptance.

If, upon the second validation, the declaration does not meet the Taric requirements an IM416 message will issue stating that declaration has been rejected. No further action can be taken on the declaration once is at a status of Rejected or Not Released.

If this arises a new declaration will need to be submitted. This will need to be an IMA type declaration, as the goods have now been presented/arrived, conforming to the Taric requirements in force.
