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Background

Traders who conduct customs activities into or out of the [European Union \(EU\)](#) are required to have an Economic Operators Registration and Identification (EORI) number. Each EORI is a unique identification number and the underlying details linked to it include the holders name and address, including the Eircode or postcode. This number is valid throughout the EU and is used as a common reference number for interactions with the customs authorities in any Member State.

Eircode/Postcode Requirement

In collaboration with the EU Commission, Revenue is currently reviewing the details of all traders registered for a EORI in Ireland. It has been noted that a large number of Irish registered EORI numbers are non-compliant as they do not contain an Eircode/postcode. As well as being non-compliant with the EORI legal requirements, the absence of the Eircode/postcode detail in an EORI, could result in the rejection of declarations submitted into the export system - AES and the transit system - NCTS.

Action You Need to Take as a Holder of an Irish Registered EORI Number

If you are registered for EORI in Ireland, you should click [here](#) to

- Verify the accuracy and completeness of your EORI records including confirming that an Eircode or postcode is included.
- Where necessary, update your details, including a valid Eircode or postcode in the address field.

Please note that EORI records can only be updated in the Member State of Establishment.

New EORI Registrations

Please ensure that for all new EORI registrations with Revenue, an Eircode is to be included in the address. For details on EORI registration please see the link
