Note 1 - Completing the Application

This application form is to be completed by Irish Whiskey producers who are applying to Revenue for verification that their production facilities and processes adhere to the Technical File for the Irish Whiskey Geographical Indication. A separate application is required for each tax warehouse where a production process requiring verification is to be carried out.

Before completing this application, producers are advised to read the Revenue guidelines on **www.revenue.ie** (Revenue Verification of Irish Whiskey).

Completed applications should be sent to the producer's local Revenue office.

If a stage of production is carried out at a different tax warehouse an application for that stage must be made by the person authorised to operate at that tax warehouse to the local Revenue office. This applies to the final production stages of maturation, blending, bottling and labelling only.

Note 2 - Description of Production Processes and Controls

As part of this application, Irish Whiskey producers are required to provide a description of their production processes and systems for every production stage carried out at the tax warehouse identified in this application. The description should include the processes, stills and materials used or to be used by the producer in their Irish Whiskey production, etc., the systems and procedures used to ensure compliance with the GI requirements. The producer should also provide a description of the data and information systems used by them to provide assurance of compliance. If the premises is to be used to produce spirits other than Irish Whiskey, the application should include a full description of the control procedures to be used to prevent cross-contamination.

Note 3 - Verification Fee

A fee of €250 is payable to Revenue for each stage of Irish Whiskey production verified. You will receive a payment notice requesting payment when the completed application form has been processed by Revenue.
