1. Introduction

National legislation provides for controls on the importation of fireworks. For the purposes of this manual, the term importation includes both third country and intra-EU movements.

2. Legislation

The importation of fireworks is covered by the following primary and secondary legislation:

- Explosives Act 1875
- S.I. No. 450 of 1994
- S.I. No. 174 of 2015.

Fireworks may only be imported if accompanied by a licence issued by the Department of Justice.
